



CAMPING WITH PACK 247

Dates: Friday, May 8th - Sunday, May 12th

Where: Moqui Group Campground (Spooner Site) **CONTACT: Jenn B. 602-751-1431**

From Payson, Arizona, drive 46 miles north on AZ 87 toward Winslow. Turn right onto FR 138 and drive about one mile to the campground. It will be on the left about 1 mile.

From Anthem, Arizona, drive 57 miles north on I-17 towards Flagstaff. Take exit 285 for General Crook Trail. Turn right on Gen Crook Trail. Turn right on AZ-260 E. When you hit the light, continue straight to stay on AZ-260 E for 32 miles. Turn left on AZ-87 N for 20 miles. Turn right on Forest Service Rd 138. Campground will be about 1 mile down the road on the left.

Check-in: Between 4:00PM on Friday

Check-out: 12:00 PM on Sunday

Who: All scouts and at least 1 adult - this is a family campout. The entire family is welcome to come!

Cost: The pack is covering the cost for each scout and 1 adult. **Additional family members are \$10 per person, with a maximum of \$25 per family.**

PACK LIST

The following items should be packed in a **backpack or daypack** and carried by each Scout during hiking activities:

- Small First Aid Kit
- Water Bottle / Canteen
- Flashlight / Headlight
- Trail Food
- Sunscreen
- Whistle

Suggested, but not required as part of the six essentials:

- compass
- extra batteries
- notepad/pencil

SHELTER

- Tent with poles & stakes
- Ground Cloth or Tarp for under tent
- Shade Structure (i.e. EZ-Up)
- Tent Broom/Dustpan
- Sleeping bag/blanket
- Pillow
- Air mattress, pad or cot (if desired)

CAMPSITE

- Camp Chairs or Stools
- Plastic bags (for trash, dirty clothes)
- Lantern
- Walking stick (if desired)

TOOLS

- Hammer or Rubber Mallet
- Cord or Rope
- Shovel
- Rake

- Pocket Knife - *Only Scouts who have their Whittling Chip AND have adult supervision*

DOWN TIME

- Frisbee/balls/outdoor activities
- Bible/books/cards
- Camera
- Walkie Talkies

MEALTIME/SNACKTIME

- Snacks/ drinks
- Water
- Paper towels and/or napkins
- Cooler
- Table (if desired)

CLOTHING

- Rain gear / poncho (if desired)
- Warm jacket / long sleeve shirt / sweatshirt / sweatpants / jammies
- Change of clothes, extra clothes & socks
- Cub scout uniforms - **Class A & B**
- Durable shoes/boots (closed toe) - **no Crocs, sandals, flip flops**
- Hat/cap or scarf (if cold)
- Gloves (if cold)

PERSONAL ITEMS

- Baby wipes / washcloth
- Medicine (if needed)
- Toothbrush / toothpaste
- Comb / Brush
- Hand sanitizer
- Toilet paper (enough for your tent/family)
- Deodorant
- Sunscreen
- Insect Repellent
- Sunglasses
- Female supplies (if applicable)
- Hair accessories (if applicable)
- Chapstick

- ✿ 1:30 - 2:00 PM Clean up: Everyone asked to participate in lunch clean up
- ✿ 2:00 - 2:30 PM Clean up and Change for Crossover
- ✿ 2:30 PM - 3:30 PM Flag and Crossover Ceremonies: Den Leaders to lead flag ceremony for the Pack. Scouts must be in complete Class A Uniform (Neckerchief, Hat, Shirt, Belt). After the ceremony, please change to Class B Uniform (t-shirt) for the rest of the activities
- ✿ 3:30 - 5:00 PM Free time and Dinner Prep
- ✿ 5:00 PM - 6:30 PM Dinner: Dinner will be provided by the pack.

Special Instructions

- ✿ Have all Scouts wash their hands frequently
- ✿ Friday Dinner is on your own. Pack is NOT providing.
- ✿ Please bring enough food for your family for all snacks.
- ✿ Please make sure that you bring enough water and other drinks desired for your entire family.
- ✿ Quiet time is observed from 9:30 PM - 7:00 AM
- ✿ Please do not plan to arrive, pack/unpack, or leave camp during quiet time
- ✿ Smoking is not allowed
- ✿ If a campfire is not allowed due to restrictions, we will cook using propane heating units unless under Class 3 restrictions where no flames are permitted
- ✿ Schedule subject to change as necessary

Items NOT Allowed by BSA

- ➔ Firearms/ammunition/bows/arrows
- ➔ Fireworks
- ➔ Alcohol
- ➔ Electronics (Radios, Tablet/iPad/Kindle, Personal Gaming Devices such as Nintendo DS, etc.)
- ➔ Pets (dogs, cats, turkeys, ferrets, birds, etc.)
- ➔ RVs or trailers
